Origins

Fraser is strongly connected to Fraser Technical College and WINTEC. We proudly belong to Ngaati Maahanga in the Waikato.

Ngaati Maahanga

Tuuheitia and Maahanga are important ancestors of the Waikato people. Tuuheitia was a renowned warrior whose home was never attacked by enemies. This is commemorated in the saying,

<i>Haere mai ki ahau</i>	<i>Come to me</i>
<i>Ki Te Papa-o-Rotu</i>	<i>To Te Papa-o-Rotu</i>
<i>Ki te au tē rena,</i>	<i>To the unstirred current</i>
<i>Ki te urunga tē taka,</i>	<i>To the pillow that falls not</i>
<i>Ki te moenga tē whakaarahia.</i>	<i>And the undisturbed sleep.</i>
<i>Ahakoa iti taku iti</i>	<i>Although I am small</i>
<i>He rei kei roto.</i>	<i>I have teeth.</i>

Tuuheitia was eventually killed at sea, but was transformed into a taniwha. His son Maahanga travelled. He is the ancestor of Ngaati Maahanga, an important iwi within Waikato-Tainui. Oomaero and Te Kaharoa are two marae of Ngaati Maahanga. Oomaero is near Whatawhata, and Te Kaharoa in the Aramiro valley near Raglan.

Scholastic Heritage

Established in 1920 as Hamilton Day School, in 1924 the school's name was changed to Technical College. When the school relocated to Ellicott Road, the name changed to Fraser High School in honour of Mr Whampoa Fraser, Principal (1925 – 1949).

Mr Fraser was the first Principal of the Hamilton Technical College and was hugely admired for his many accomplishments in professional, sporting and community associations in the Waikato and in Auckland. He embodied old-fashioned values that promoted community and family. Our school is based on the timeless values of our school's history.

Waikato Taniwharau

Mr Fraser understood the cultural significance of the area to Maaori and this consequently enhanced the identity of the school. Through his contact with Maaori Principals and kaumaatua at the time, he was directed to Waikato Taniwharau. Te Kura Tuarua o Taniwharau is a direction that we aspire to – leading learning in our community and nurturing many leaders. We are proud to acknowledge our New Zealand identity and turangawaewae.

Junior

Responsive Learning

A Year 8's transition from Primary or Intermediate school to secondary school, can be complicated by the social, emotional and biological changes occurring to them at this time. At Fraser, we understand how these changes affect our students and we are better placed to support them make positive adjustments to Fraser.

We endeavour to maintain class size to 24 students. Our senior student leaders actively facilitate peer support activities and mentoring. Fraser's LEAD programme is focussed on building foundation skills and attitudes necessary for our Year 9 students' success, nurturing a sense of belonging and confidence to learn at Fraser.

The junior school is designed for teachers who plan and teach in small learning teams, to be responsive to our students' learning needs in a timely manner. The junior school curriculum uses flexible learning approaches, integrating ideas and concepts across all learning areas, and specific skills development. Learning is culturally responsive and meaningful.

Fraser's imperative is to continue to design a range of deliberate and purposeful learning experiences that are connected to a vocational pathway(s). Our staff have designed innovative learning projects targeted to enhance the learning of specific learners. Examples include: MusicPro, Hei Taniwha, Agriculture, and Engineering. These learning projects will increase in variety, because Fraser actively seeks partnerships with Wintec, Universities and community businesses, to extend the boundaries of the senior curriculum. Academic learning programmes include the Cambridge International programme.

At Fraser we endeavour to empower our students to be confident in their abilities and goals; to be connected to communities, both locally and internationally; actively involved in their communities, be life-long learners, use their learning to benefit others, and improve their position in the world.

To ensure your child learns and achieves their aspirations and goals we are committed to employing dynamic staff with expertise in their fields of teaching in front of every class.


