What are HUBS and who’s involved?

The Junior School HUBS are designed to encourage connection amongst students, their kaiako (teachers) and their learning program. Each HUB is taught by a specific team of kaiako who work closely together to ensure the needs and interests of their students are met.

Our aakonga (students) are supported by the same kaiako throughout their junior school learning (years 9 and 10). Also within HUBs we have more teaching hours with our students. This allows us to formulate more authentic relationships with our aakonga and provides us many opportunities to support the overall pastoral and academic care of each student.

Aakonga will develop a rich understanding of their identity, goals and possible pathways, as well as understanding where they fit within their wider school and community.

Over these precious formative years our learners are taught within a ‘concept curriculum’ that allows for students to experience teacher-led, guided and student-led learning. They are able to explore contextual ideas through an integrated curriculum (Numeracy, Literacy, Social Science, Science, Mathematics, English, Health and Physical Education) that is authentic and relevant to them.
